HEE have just released information regarding the release of an offer of one-off non-recurrent funding to provide recovery training grants for Healthcare Scientists, the first time that healthcare scientist have been considered CPD funding support. This funding has been possible through their in-year investment process, and as such will need to be spent before the end of the financial year (March 2023). HEE have proposed being able to provide funding to support training and education at £333 per eligible staff member. Further information to follow.


#### **HEE MSc. funding opportunity.**
